

# Theme Park Packing List: *Your Essentials*



**Start your theme park day right with these essential items:**

- Comfortable shoes** - Some parks are *BIG*. Make sure you are prepared for a *LOT* of walking!  
– Waterproof options are a great idea for the wetter rides (or weather!).
- Spare socks/underwear** - Water rides are all fun and games... Until you realise you're soaked!
- Belt bag** - “bum bag” / “fanny pack”... Either way, keep your personal items secure and organised.
- Waterproof pouch** - Protect your belongings from water damage with a small pouch in your bag.
- Rain poncho** - Don't pay more than you need to for a cheap, plastic poncho! Bring your own along!
- Snacks** - Keep the cost down and wait times shorter by bringing some food to help you power through the day.
- Water bottle** - HYDRATE. Especially on those hotter days. And *ESPECIALLY* especially in Florida!
- Portable phone charger** - Mobile apps, maps and photos are integral to a park day. Don't lose power!
- Sunscreen and Sunglasses** - Lots of parks lack shaded, indoor areas - especially in queue lines.
- Hand sanitiser** - Railings, restraints, restaurants and rides... Keep your hands clean!
- First aid** - Bring along paracetamol, blister plasters and motion sickness relief. Better to be safe than sorry!

# Theme Park Packing List:

## *Kids' Essentials*



*In addition to your list, you might consider these items for your child:*

- Nappies and supplies** - You know your child best, but don't forget to bring along the important bits!
- Rain cover/sun canopy** - Protect your little one (and pushchair!) from harsher weather conditions.
- Spare outfit** - Play areas, water rides and pools are common in theme parks. You might need to swap out!
- Swimwear** - If the park has a water play area, your child will be much more comfortable in this.
- Sun hat** - Simple, yet effective. Don't forget to protect your child's scalp (but take it off on the faster rides!).
- Cooling fan or towel** - Hot days, hot countries, open spaces... Hydration and keeping cool is essential.
- Snacks/bottles** - Bring enough to avoid having a 'hangry' child... You'll thank yourself for this one.
- Wet Wipes** - Help to keep their sticky hands and faces clean. These can also be used on eating surfaces!
- Ziplock bags** - A pro-tip. Any unfinished snacks can be saved for later (especially expensive in-park food!).
- Small toys or travel games** - Queue lines can be *long*. Fidget toys and mobile apps can also help.
- Pocket money** - Seize the opportunity to reward great behaviour by reminding them to bring their own hard-earned money to spend.
